7.1	<b>20/01706/AS</b> Land north west of Swan Street House, Charing Heath: Reserved matters application for approval of layout, scale landscaping and appearance pursuant to outline planning permission 18/00868/AS (outline application for development of the land for five new dwellings to consider access) and to consider conditions 10,14 &16 (unanimous)(recommend support)
7.2	<b>21/00171/AS Millgarth The Hill Charing:</b> Variation of condition 02 of planning permission 19/00445/AS (Demolition of existing dwelling and erection of x2 dwellings) to alter the approved ground level and resultant design .(11 for 1 abstention)(recommend refusal with conditions)

7.3	<b>20/01718/AS Beacon Hill Quarry, Pilgrims Way Charing:</b> Section 73 Application to vary conditions1,21 & 20 of planning permission AS/97/360/MR13 to extend the date for the completion of extraction of minerals and the removal of all buildings and plant by 10 years until 31 <sup>st</sup> December 2030. (Condition 1) and the date for completion of restoration until 31 <sup>st</sup> December 2035 (Condition 21) and to amend the reinstatement aftercare and after use requirements to increase opportunities for ecological enhancement (Condition20)(raise no objection)

8.1	Beacon Hill Quarry: It is possible when the end of the quarrying occurs in a few years' time that an application could be put in for 3-4 houses. Money could be given for the resurfacing of Pilgrims Way. The current licence is due to expire in 8-9 years. It was asked if this could be added to our NP. It was felt that it was too late to add at this stage but could be added at review stage.

9.1	4x4 drivers have been causing damage on the roundabout, Pilgrims Way and Racecourse during the snow.

9.3	A meeting was held with Shepherd Neame re the field at the back of the public house for housing .They have now revised their plans and are putting in a new design of smaller dwellings which is required in the parish.

9.6	Cllr Prinn had spoken to Brett's re the access off Tile Lodge Rd, they are going to rectify the damage to the verges. A neighbour has also reported his garden flooding since work gas started. A resident in the new dwellings in Church Hill has reported seeing newts and a Adonis blue butterfly.
