4.	Public Participation Session:
	This provides an opportunity for members of the public to raise questions about and comment
	on items on the agenda. Time for this session is limited to 10 minutes (divided by the number of
	participants)
	There were 8 members of the public present re application no 22/00256/AS and members of
	Shepherd Neame were present to answer any questions from residents and councillors.
	An indepth discussion took place regardingthe application which lasted a hour. Concerns raised
	were that one the proposed bungalow windows would look immediately into one of the houses
	on the previous development due to the house being lower than the site that the proposed
	development would be on. The further away the bungalows the more you would be able to see
	into the house facing the area. Discussions included :
	1. Turning the bungalow end round so the gable overlooked the house rather than a window.
	2. Mature planting of trees of a minum of 10ft high to be planted. 3. Other concerns were regarding the exit access and lights shining into windows opposite, after
	discussions representitives said they would look into whether the exit could be lowered slightly /
	dipped so that the vehicle lights would not shine in the windows. Representatives from
	Shepherd Neame could not see any problems with the turning of the bungalow and the mature
	planting to screen the house.
	It was explained to residents that the parish council had received documentation re the
	remaining green space on the proposed development being gifted to the parish council subject
	to covenants that the land will remain for the community. The gift also of the freehold land on
	which the Memorial Hall sits on.
