	comment on whether the applicant is making a living. The farmer has taken back 35 acres of arable land
	under his control and will be taking back the rest of the arable land on 1 st October 2021, he is at present
	farming 55% of his land and will be farming 75%, the remaining 25% being the equestrian business.
