One to each flat roof.B) Stripping and recovering the two flat roofs.C)Removal of the window to the west elevation of the kitchen and replacement with French Doors. D)Forming a new opening in the south elevation of the kitchen and infilling it with blockwork andwaterproof render.F)A portion of the wall in which the personnel door is situated is half brick thick. An inner skin will be provided to assist thermal insulation resulting in a cavity wall construction to align with the external wallsof the litchen.G)Replacement of two softwood window frames (one ground floor level and one at first floor level)in the north gable and using OAKframes to a similar design to the existing frames .H)Removal of a modern stud work wall between the front and rear rooms of the ground floor of the building.
